



# 2018 JUNIOR FAIR LIVESTOCK SALE



## Exhibitor Fact Sheet—2018 Changes

The Preble County Senior Fair Board in cooperation with the Preble County Sale Committee is announcing the following changes **effective for the 2018 Preble County Fair**. These changes are made with careful consideration of many factors including feedback given by buyers, exhibitors and parents; observation of past sales and the impact of other changes to the Junior Fair. Many Fairs across Ohio—including Preble County—have examined the traditions of their sales and made changes to:

- Make the sale better for all parties involved
- Maximize the earning potential for all exhibitors
- Shorten the sale to achieve the above goals

### SUMMARY OF CHANGES


#### Sale of Champions

**CHANGE:** Buyer's groups will be eliminated (this includes Friends of ... groups)

*Exhibitors with Champion and Reserve Champion animals will no longer be permitted to collect lists of buyers. Animals will go through the sale ring and be bid on by registered buyers in attendance in a true live auction.*

#### **Other Points**

- Buyers can still add on to an exhibitor's animal.
- Buyers in groups of up to 3 can purchase an animal during the live auction



#### Livestock Sale

**CHANGE:** Exhibitors may sell one animal per species for a premium bid. All animals that are eligible for a packer bid will receive a packer bid.

*For example: A Jr. Fair Exhibitor shows 2 market lambs. She or he will receive a premium bid through the auction for one of the market lambs. Both of the market lambs can go to the packer and receive the packer bid.*

**CHANGE:** The fee for tags will increase to \$4

#### **Other Points**

- Buyers can still add on to an exhibitor's animal.
- Buyers in groups of up to 3 can purchase an animal during the live auction
- Exhibitors still have the option of scratching an animal from the sale.

### WHAT IS STAYING THE SAME

Many aspects of the sale are remaining the same. Specifically...

- Exhibitors may still show 2 animals in species where this is permissible
- Upon sale, hogs, steers, lambs, goats, rabbits and poultry are the property of the designated livestock company.
- Exhibitors are responsible for their market stock until loaded for shipment following sale. This includes getting their animal to the sale ring at the designated time.
- The Preble County Junior Fair Market Livestock Sale will be a terminal sale.
- If a market animal (including feeder calves) will not be sold in the sale, the exhibitor must inform the department committee 30 minutes after the conclusion of the market show. Any animal that is not scratched within the 30 minutes time limit, will be included in the sale.
