

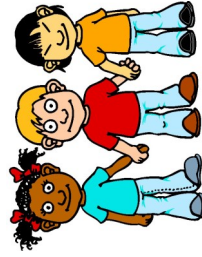
Finding a Club for Your Family

1. Look for a club that meets in a place that is convenient.
2. Select a club that meets during times that work with your family's schedule.
3. Find a club that accepts members within your child's age range. *Project Members:* Must be at least age 8 and in 3rd grade as of Jan. 1st. *Cloverbuds:* Must be at least age 5 and in Kindergarten as of Jan. 1st.
4. Decide what kind of projects your child plans to take and find a club that accepts those kinds of projects.
5. Contact the advisor for more detailed club information. Ask about: participation/attendance requirements, club dues and fundraising, meeting schedule, location, club size, and any other questions you may have.
6. Ask what kind of involvement or participation the club expects from parents.
7. Set up a visit to a club meeting or jump right in. Have fun and enjoy your 4-H Club experience!



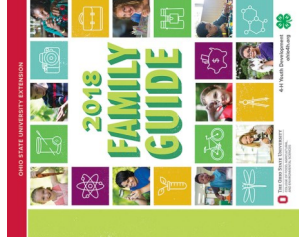
