### Help for Enrolling

On our website at <https://preble.osu.edu/program-areas/4-h-youth-development/how-join-4-h> you will find a link to 4honline as well as a tutorial. Both links are under the heading: Where do I sign up. Remember that 4honline does not like cell phones and if you are having issues enrolling using your phone, that is probably why.

We posted two video tutorials on our Facebook page as a helpful guide to completing enrollment. Thanks to my colleague, Amanda Raines, for creating and sharing these videos.

- Please remember to complete your enrollment.
- Also, please keep confirming your members. Nancy will be watching and confirming members as well.

### Members:

- Please continue to enroll through 4honline. Remember that if you are a returning member—**DO NOT build a new profile**. Just log in to your current profile, check your information, sign where needed and update your projects. IF you have trouble logging in, contact Nancy. **Do not build a new profile!**
- Questions regarding your enrollment, should be asked via email. Please do not post these questions on Facebook. Ideally, send questions to Nancy at [Tilton.47@osu.edu](mailto:Tilton.47@osu.edu) because she is the one who handles the 4honline enrollment. - If you do not have access to the internet, we now have public internet at our office that does not require a password. We tested our public internet and it seems to be working from our parking lot. As long as our county building (not our office) remains open, you should be able to access the internet inside the building as well. Look for WiFi@OSU. We also saw where the fairgrounds has internet that you can access on the grounds and many restaurants have free WiFi that extends to the parking lot.
- Your profile will remain pending until your advisor and Nancy complete confirming it. You may receive an email with something to fix. If you do, please do that as soon as possible.
- Remember that once you submit you cannot go back and make changes to your profiles (like adding projects). If you find that you need to make changes after you click submit, please contact us via email so that we can help you make those changes.
- If you get a message that says the county is not taking enrollments at this time, this is a common error when using a cell phone to enroll. 4honline does not work well with cell phones typically.

### **INFORMATION ABOUT EXTENSION AND 4-H PROGRAMMING as of end of day on March 25...**

*from State 4-H Leader Kirk Bloir...*

Ohio State University Extension 4-H Youth Development is committed to doing our part to help defeat the mass spread of the novel coronavirus.

- All 4-H activities, club meetings, events, and programs must be held virtually between now and **May 15**. Events that cannot be held virtually must be postponed or cancelled.
- We may need to extend the ban on in-person gatherings beyond May 15. The situation is dynamic and changes daily. We will continue to monitor conditions and will reevaluate as needed.
- 4-H club advisors are encouraged to explore the tip sheets and other information provided at [go.osu.edu/4Hadvisorinfo](http://go.osu.edu/4Hadvisorinfo). Two of the resources are one-pagers to share with club advisors and volunteers: "Communicating Online with your Club", and "Tips & Tricks for Meetings When You Can't Meet (in person)." We also have a couple of 4-H Online help sheets.
- 4-H members and their families should consider a number of factors as they make their decisions to purchase 4-H market livestock projects. As with any agricultural enterprise, possible risks and rewards must be taken into account. For example, we encourage families to consider their overall available budget, space to care for livestock, availability of alternative markets, availability of local processing and family freezer space.

### **MAY TAGGING DAY—LAMBS, GOATS AND HOGS**

The Senior Fair Board made the decision yesterday to cancel the May 3 weigh in/ tag in for lambs and goats. This applies to the collection of hog DNA and paperwork as well. Therefore, all sheep/goats/hog tags can be purchased at the Sr Fair Board office starting March 23rd. Use the walk up window to pick up tags. Tags need to be returned to Sr Fair Board office by close of business on May 4th. If you need help with tagging, please contact the office at 937-456-3748.

Please tag your animals as soon as possible and return paperwork and DNA to office to avoid large crowds of people doing that at the same time.

### **NEW ADVISORS**

We are continuing to process new advisor applications. Reference are being sent and as those and background checks are completed, interviews will be scheduled. We will be doing interviews virtually as well as the new advisor training scheduled for April.

If you have submitted an application, please remind your references to return the form they receive in the mail. This is the hold up right now for processing quite a few applications.

Also, we know that at this time, you cannot complete your background check. The Sheriff's office is not doing background checks right now. You can get these done once things return to normal.

### **4-H BOOKS AND PUBLICATIONS**

Plans are in the works at the State level to help get project materials out to 4-H members. Look for new information soon.

Project book distribution is suspended by Ohio 4-H through March 31. That date will be reevaluated closer to the time and we will provide you with updates as we receive them.
